#8 Persecuted Country in 2014: Pakistan

Christians suffer from 'Islamic extremism' and to a lesser extent 'organised corruption'. Pakistan's Christians face both Islamic militant organisations and mobs that routinely and violently target Christians, and an Islamising culture that results in Christians being isolated from the rest of the population. Many Christians who can afford to leave the country are leaving. Some observers are talking about the 'Talibanisation' of the Pakistani society. The notorious blasphemy laws continue to have devastating

consequences for minorities, including Christians. 'Church' in Pakistan is not just a place of worship for the average Christian there; it is also a place for social activities. Women and girls are experiencing violence every day. Women and girls from minority groups especially are vulnerable and easy targets for rape and sexual abuse. They are easy prey and considered to be inferior people. Sexual assaults against underage Christian girls by Muslim men continue to be reported. Catholic NGOs estimate at least 700 Christian girls are kidnapped and forced to convert to Islam every year.
