#### **Doonside Mission**

There has been many positive steps recently in the Doonside community particularly among indigenous groups we previously had little contact with. Through contact with a local elder, Tony has been able to be in contact with local indigenous and their service providers in the area. Although the Footy in the Park concluded, it made good connections with Chief Inspector Robert Fitzgerald of Blacktown Police. A recent meeting with Robert Fitzgerald, another local and Tony, has resulted in Tony being the contact person for a men's group. The group will meet on the first monday of the month primarily but not exclusively for indigenous men. Tony and Wendy were invited to the open day for the new Ngallu Wal Aboriginal Child and Family Centre in Doonside

last Friday. With 5% of the local population being indigenous, wouldn't it be wonderful to have that reflected among us!

### #13 Persecuted Country in 2014: Libya

The position of Christians was already extremely difficult, and has only deteriorated, making Libya the worst ranking country in North Africa. Within anarchy and absent rule of law, Christians - both nationals and foreigners - are squeezed between fanatical religious groups and criminal gangs. As in most Muslim countries, converting from Islam brings social pressure. Muslim Background Believers are always at risk from their families; there were some reported cases of beatings by family members. Most Libyan Christians are afraid to meet with other believers, as any kind of religious gathering (other than Islamic) for Libyans is forbidden. Expats are allowed to have their own churches, but Libyans are not allowed to attend. After the demise of Gadhafi's regime, the source of persecution has changed, but Christians continue to experience high levels of pressure in all spheres of life. Now, Islamist fanatical movements such as the Salafists are responsible for most of the persecution and violent incidents against Christians, in a country where there is no central government and where rule of law is absent.

## Christians Subjugated In Raqqa Syria

Since January 2014 the terror group ISIS has ruled the northern city of Al Raqqa. Sharia is enforced and the whole community lives in terror of ISIS's extreme violence. Recently 20 Christian leaders were taken captive and given

three options: convert to Islam, submit to Islam as dhimmis (humiliated and subjugated under Islam) or 'face the sword'. The Christian leaders signed an agreement committing the Christian community to submission. Just as in the Middle Ages, Christians must now pay protection money (jizya) as mandated by the Qur'an (Sura 9:29). They must demonstrate respect for Islam and Muslims and abstain from all public expressions of Christianity and from renovating churches and monasteries. If they breach the agreement, ISIS will resume war against them. Please pray for Syria and its Christians. Source: Religious Liberty Prayer Bulletin
