

Pray for our Persecuted brothers and sisters

Country: Syria (#4)

Leader: President Bashar al-Assad

Population: 22.3 million (Christian: 1.1 million)

Main Religion: Islam

Government: Republican (under an authoritarian regime)

Main Source of Persecution: Islamic Extremism

What is it like for Christians in Syria?

Syria is now entering into its 5th year of civil war. Despite moving down in rank from the 2014 World Watch List, persecution has increased in Syria. This is largely due to the rise in influence of radical Islamic groups, especially with the increased persecution from the militant group Islamic State.

Islamic State introduced the caliphate in large parts of Syria and Iraq at the end of June 2014. A strict version of Sharia law was implemented. Syrian society is radicalising especially in areas controlled by radical Islamic groups. In the meantime, most Christians have fled IS controlled areas.

Though all Christians are affected by persecution, this is especially true for Christians from historical churches and converts from Islam (Muslim Background Believers, MBBs).

Many Christians have left the country, and despite this there are growing numbers of people are coming to Christ in the midst of all that is happening. Praise God!

Prayer Points:

- For Christians who are displaced within the country or are refugees in camps outside of Syria
- For Open Doors workers, who partner with churches and other Christian organizations, providing food, shelter and trauma counseling to the refugees
- That there would be an end to the horrific civil war which has been waged for approximately four years
