Pray for our persecuted brothers and sisters

Country: China Leader: President Xi Jinping Population: 1.41 billion

Main Religion: Atheism **Government:** Communist State **Main Source of Persecution:** Communist Oppression

Under the new president, Xi Jinping, the Communist government aims at controlling religious activities. While in most regions in China Christian activities have been watched rather than controlled, unregistered house churches especially could be affected by a new program to eradicate so-called 'evil cults' – some of which have (contorted) Christian roots. Observers note three kinds of churches amongst the ethnic Han: the 'black' ones which are illegal and which the state is fighting against (for example, Roman Catholics loyal to the Vatican), the 'red' ones which are state-approved and controlled, and the 'grey' ones, which are not registered but tolerated and which form the majority of the Christian population.

In most cases, police refrain from violence, but invite pastors to 'have tea' to clarify rules and limits. The situation in the Muslim-minority state of Xinjiang, where the Uyghur minority lives, deteriorated rapidly compared to last year and life for the small number of Christian converts (most likely a few thousand) has become more complicated and even more limited than before. They suffer from increased general pressure from the government as well as their own families, friends and neighbours. A similar situation is faced by an even smaller group of Christian converts (numbering a few hundred) from a Tibetan Buddhist background, in the Chinese region of Tibet. Whereas pressure and violence are not as high as in Xinjiang at the moment, it still is on a comparable level. Virtually all reports of regular violence were limited to the Southern province of Zhejiang, also known as the 'Jerusalem of China', where local authorities started a campaign against religious structures. Some were completely destroyed and more than 300 crosses on church buildings were allegedly dismantled. While these events do not seem to be the beginning of a wider campaign, they appear to serve as a 'suggestion' that churches should not become too visible. Please pray for our brothers and sisters in China.
