Question Box Sunday is a great tradition at Westview. Over many years people have served our church well by asking questions through the question box, questions arising from our teaching program, from reading the scriptures, from listening to others preach the word and questions of a more general nature, about life and how to live it in light of what God desires for us as his people. Questions are submitted anonymously, a practice that has allowed people to ask about issues or topics which they may not have been comfortable doing face to face in a home group or to one of the elders. And in many instances questions asked have been on the minds of others in our community and so have helped many people think through things and gain knowledge, and sometimes even understanding of these perplexing issues.

Questions are dealt with, addressed, considered on Question Box Sunday. We can't always guarantee to have the definitive answer to every question asked. But what we always attempt to do is address these questions respectfully and thoughtfully, always looking to God's holy scriptures for inspiration, guidance, leading principles and truth as we attempt to find the way ahead through the questions that are submitted. 
Update from Bay & Beck Ayling

Pray for our persecuted brothers and sisters

Country: Somalia Leader: President Hassan Sheikh Mohamoud

Population: 10.6 million Main Religion: Islam

Main Source of Persecution: Islamic Extremism

No place for Christianity

There is no place for Christianity in Somalia. The government, religious leaders and militant group al-Shabaab all maintain that Christianity is unwanted and Islam is the only acceptable religion. Christians are forced to meet in secret and face violence from their family and clans.

A Church pushed out

Missionaries brought Christianity to Somalia in the 1800s and 1900s. However, Italian and French colonialists, and later Somali nationalists, hindered mission work. Most missionaries had left Somalia by the 1970s. Political instability has plagued the country and substantially impacted the growth of the church. Christianity was preceded in Somalia by Islam. Radical Islamic groups and the Islamic government have attempted to stamp out Christianity. Though the missionaries established churches in Somalia, today only ruins of the old church buildings exist.

Meeting in secret

Christians meet in secret but the government has stepped up measures to investigate where Christians meet and find out who is involved in supporting and training Christians and reaching out to Muslims. Muslim Background Believers (MBBs) face more severe persecution than MBBs in many other countries. In recent years, MBBs have often been killed on the spot when their Christian faith is discovered. Militant group al-Shabaab has publicly declared that it 'wants Somalia free of all Christians'. There is a strong drive from al-Shabaab and others to remove all traces of Christianity from Somalia, verging on genocide or ethnic cleansing. The government's aversion to Christianity means that there is no protection for Christians from violent radical Islamic groups.

Please Pray:

- > For the Christian converts in Somalia who fear for their lives.
- > For the underground church in Somalia, that God would sustain it and grant it protection.
- > For an end to the civil war, famine and drought which has plagued the nation since 1991.
