Pray for our persecuted brothers and sisters

Country: Sudan Leader: President Umar Hasson Ahmad al-Bashir

Population: 36 million Main Religion: Islam

Main Source of Persecution: Islamic Extremism

Christians regarded as second class citizens

□Though Sudan has moved two spots down the World Watch List in 2016, persecution against Christians has increased. Believers face persecution from Islamic extremism and the government. With 97% of the population being Muslim, and Christianity perceived to be foreign to Sudanese culture, Christians are regarded as second-class citizens.

Punishing MBBs, demolishing churches, and detaining Christian pastors and priests are just some of the ways Christians are persecuted in Sudan.

Severe violations of religious freedom

Sudan was one of the few African countries that has consistently been on the World Watch List since its first use in 1993. Since 1999, Sudan has been designated a "Country of Particular Concern" by the US State Department for its 'severe violations of religious freedom'.

Converting punishable by death

□Persecution of Christians has increased, particularly in the Nuba region. Muslim Background Believers (MBBs) face the worst persecution. Christians, and particularly MBBs, are monitored by Muslim religious leaders and politicians. The punishment for converting from Islam to another religion is death.

In October 2015, two churches were demolished in separate incidents and for false reasons. In one instance, authorities only gave the church 72 hours notice that their church would be demolished, citing re-development requirements.

Churches, schools and hospitals have been under continuous attack in different parts of the country, causing injury and death. Since 2012, more than 4,000 bombs were dropped on civilian targets in the Nuba region.

Please Pray:

- > That the apostasy laws will be abolished.
- > For Christians who have been detained to remain steadfast in their faith and convictions.
- > For Christians around the Nuba mountains to be kept safe from bombings and continue meeting together.
