

The way that a person sees and understands the world is called a "worldview". It matters not whether a person has faith, we all want love, meaning, relationships, and the means to sustain and allow life to flourish. On a surface level, this is common to all humanity. Our particular



worldview will determine how we go about fulfilling these things, and this is where tension and conflict can be most obviously found in our lives.

We continue our series in Daniel where God's people find themselves in a foreign land and the opposing worldview could not be any clearer. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were valuable members of the king's court where they must have prospered and enjoyed many benefits because of their faithful service, however when confronted with a clear ultimatum to worship something other than the true God or die a horrible death, their choice was clear to them.

The Scriptures describe us today as God's people in a foreign land, and where we often are free to live a life of faith following Jesus Christ as our Lord, how we handle the small (almost insignificant) worldview conflicts will inform how we will handle the big ones. Remaining true to Christ in our hearts and minds is where we need to start, so that it will transfer to our behaviour and habits, which will strengthen our resolve for those big ultimatums we one day may face. We need to be "passionate disciples of Jesus"!

A Small But Undefeated Church

Today there stands three churches in all of Yemen, two Catholic churches and one Anglican. There are only a few hundred believers and they are constantly at risk for their faith. Until recently, the churches in Yemen were used mostly by expatriates in the country, however due to the conflict,

few non-Yemenis remain. Islamic extremists threaten believers who are discovered in Yemen and a violent branch of al-Qaeda has a strong influence of tribal hatred toward Christians.

Please Pray:

- → Pray for the few Yemeni believers, that despite the risks they would be bold in sharing their faith.
- → Pray for an end to conflict in Yemen, and for new freedoms to worship.
- → Pray for tribal leaders in Yemen to have encounters with Christ.
